A COMPANION DEVOTIONAL TO THE FILM *DAVID* FROM

ANGEL



INTRODUCTION

The story of David reminds us that God doesn't look at how strong, smart, or famous we are - He looks at the heart. This 5-part Bible Study Guide for kids and families, inspired by the Angel film DAVID, is designed for children of various ages — simple enough for young ones, yet rich enough for older kids to dive deeper, and uses the acronym D.A.V.I.D. to help kids discover what made David a true hero of faith:

- D** – Devoted to God
- A** – A Man After God's Own Heart
- V** – Victorious in Battle
- I** – Inspired Others
- D** – Determined

Each lesson includes:

- A short Bible story
- A memory verse
- Discussion questions for kids of all ages
- A simple activity and prayer

Families and groups can do one lesson per week leading up to the release of DAVID — or as a 5-day devotional journey after watching the film.





— PART 1 —

D: DEVOTED TO GOD

Main Idea: David loved God with all his heart — even when no one was watching.

Scripture: *1 Samuel 16:11–13*

Memory Verse: “Love the Lord your God with all your heart.” — *Deuteronomy 6:5*

STORY SUMMARY

Before David ever became king, he was a humble shepherd boy who spent his days caring for sheep and singing songs to God. He didn’t serve to be seen — he served because he loved God deeply.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

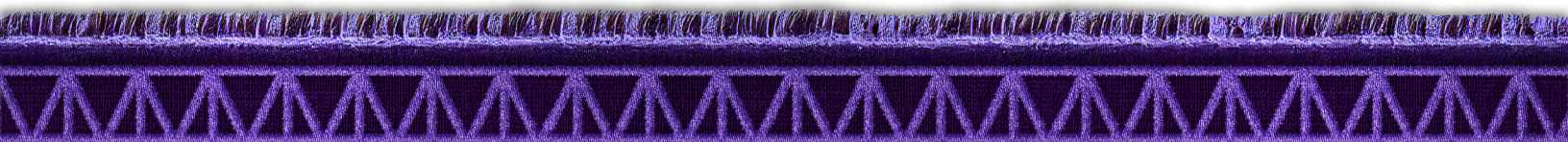
1. What does it mean to be devoted to God?
2. How did David show his devotion as a shepherd?
3. What are small ways we can show our love for God every day?

ACTIVITY: WRITE YOUR OWN PSALM

Think of one thing you’re thankful for. Write a short poem or song to God about it — just like David did in the Psalms.

PRAYER

“Dear God, thank You for loving me. Please help me to stay devoted to You, even when no one is watching. Amen.”





— PART 2 —

A: A MAN AFTER GOD'S OWN HEART

Main Idea: David's heart wanted what God wanted.

Scripture: *1 Samuel 13:14; Psalm 51:10*

Memory Verse: "Create in me a pure heart, O God." — *Psalm 51:10*

STORY SUMMARY

Even though David made big mistakes, he never stopped turning back to God. When he sinned, he prayed for forgiveness and asked God to make his heart clean again. That's one of the ways David was "a man after God's own heart."

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What do you think it means to have a heart like God's?
2. How did David show humility after he made mistakes?
3. Can we still be close to God when we've done something wrong?

ACTIVITY: CLEAN HEART CRAFT

Cut out a paper heart. On one side, write things that can make your heart heavy (anger, jealousy, selfishness). On the other side, write things that make your heart like God's (kindness, love, forgiveness).

PRAYER

"Dear Lord, thank You for loving me even when I sin. Please make my heart clean and full of Your love. Amen."



— PART 3 —
V: VICTORIOUS IN BATTLE

Main Idea: David trusted God to help him win, not his own strength.

Scripture: *1 Samuel 17:32–50*

Memory Verse: “The battle is the Lord’s.” — *1 Samuel 17:47*

STORY SUMMARY

When the giant Goliath threatened God’s people, David stood up to him with only a sling and five stones. He wasn’t afraid because he knew God was on his side. His victory came from his faith, not from his power.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What “giants” do you face — things that feel too big or scary?
2. How did David’s words show he trusted God?
3. How can we trust God to help us be victorious in our challenges?

ACTIVITY: GIANT SLAYER STONES

Find five stones (or cut them from paper). Write one way on each that you can be brave with God’s help — like “be honest,” “pray,” “forgive,” “stand up for what’s right,” or “be kind.”

PRAYER

“Dear God, please help me remember that You are bigger than my fears. Thank You that the battle belongs to You. Amen.”



— PART 4 —
I: INSPIRED OTHERS

Main Idea: David’s songs and courage inspired others to worship God.

Scripture: *Psalm 23; 2 Samuel 6:14–15*

Memory Verse: “The Lord is my shepherd.” — *Psalm 23:1*

STORY SUMMARY

David’s songs reminded people who God was — their Shepherd, their Protector, and their Friend. He danced before the Lord with joy, showing everyone that worship is about love, not performance.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. How do David’s psalms help you worship God?
2. Why do you think David danced before the Lord?
3. How can your life inspire others to love God?

ACTIVITY: INSPIRE THROUGH ART

Draw a picture of something that reminds you of God’s love — like a shepherd, a heart, or a sunrise — and give it to someone to encourage them.

PRAYER

“Thank You, Lord, for inspiring David to write songs that still help us worship You today. Please help me to live in a way that inspires others, too.”





Main Idea: David never gave up on God’s promises.

Scripture: *1 Samuel 24:1–15; 2 Samuel 5:1–4*

Memory Verse: “Wait for the Lord; be strong and take heart.” — *Psalms 27:14*

STORY SUMMARY

Even after David was anointed king, it took years for God’s promise to come true. He faced danger, betrayal, and long waiting — but he trusted God’s timing. David’s determination came from faith, not frustration.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

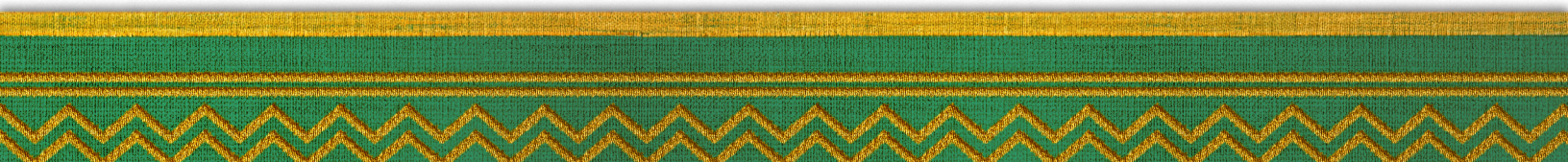
1. How did David show patience while waiting to be king?
2. Why do you think it’s hard to wait for God’s plan sometimes?
3. What can we do when we feel like giving up?

ACTIVITY: THE WAITING PATH

Draw a long, winding path. Along it, write down things you’re waiting for — a prayer to be answered, a goal, or a dream — and next to each, write “I will trust God.”

PRAYER

“Dear Lord, thank You for always keeping Your promises. Please help me to be strong and wait on You, just like David did.”



WRAP-UP REFLECTION

David wasn't perfect — but he loved God deeply.
Through every part of his story, we see that being a person after God's heart means being:

Devoted to God
After God's Own Heart
Victorious through faith
Inspired by the Spirit
Determined to follow God's plan

CHALLENGE

When watching DAVID, look for moments that illustrate each part of the acronym. Afterward, talk as a family about which part of David's story inspires you most — and how you can live it out each day.
